When & Where the Adventure Begins

Join us every other Monday (2 sessions each month) from 5:30 PM – 7:00 PM at the Ralston Transit Conference Room, unless noted otherwise.

Most outdoor activities will take place off-site.

June 15 will be held at Adams Park in Omaha (more info coming soon), and the June 27 location is still to be announced.

Hands-On Fun, Real-Life Skills



April 20 – Fuel Your Adventure: Trail Mix Workshop

Youth will create their own custom trail mix using a variety of ingredients while learning how food fuels outdoor activities and adventures.

May 4 – Wildflower Seed Bombs

Participants will make wildflower seed bombs and learn about planting, pollinators, and caring for the environment.

May 18 – Plant Your Own Herb + Sage Discussion

Youth will paint their own planters and plant herbs while learning about environmental responsibility and the Leave No Trace (LNT) principles. A brief, respectful discussion of sage and its cultural significance will also be included.

June 1 – Build Your Own Outdoor First Aid Kit

Participants will assemble a personal first aid kit while learning basic safety, preparedness, and how to respond in outdoor situations.

June 15 – *4:30 pm - 6:30 pm Emergency Shelter Building

Youth will work together to build a simple outdoor shelter while developing teamwork, problem-solving, and basic survival skills.

June 27 – *10 am - 12:30 pm Outdoor Trail Adventure

Participants will explore an outdoor trail and take part in group activities while applying skills learned throughout the program.
